STM at the 4th National Safe Motherhood Conference

Save the Mothers (STM) was honoured to prominently feature at the Ministry of Health's 4th National Safe Motherhood Conference, held in Munyonyo, Kampala, Uganda. The three-day conference opened by the Minister of Health, Dr. Jane Ruth Aceng, brought together stakeholders from various sectors committed to advancing maternal and child health.

Dr Jean Chamberlain-Froese, one of STM's founders, delivered the keynote address aligned to the conference theme '*Strengthening Community Engagement for Sustainable Maternal and Child Health*'. In her address, Dr. Jean invited delegates to reflect deeply on the essence of safe motherhood, emphasizing that "no mother or her baby should die or be harmed due to preventable pregnancy complications." She said this as a fundamental human right.

Drawing on the metaphor of a marathon, Dr. Jean illustrated the persistence and resilience required to overcome the three delays that hinder safe motherhood: delay in seeking care, delay in reaching care, and delay in receiving care.

She likened the journey to the discipline and endurance of a marathon runner, highlighting the need for sustained effort and forward planning.

"Safe motherhood," Dr Jean noted, is not just about addressing immediate needs but also about maintaining unwavering commitment for the long haul. Like a marathon, safe motherhood demands foresight, discipline, and relentless effort.

Dr. Jean underscored the critical role of community engagement in ensuring the success of safe motherhood initiatives. She asserted that every link in the chain of maternal and child health is vital, and without the active participation of all sectors including education, agriculture, faith, culture, water and sanitation, NGOs, health facilities, businesses, and community groups—the chain is weakened.

Communities must be empowered not just through knowledge but through actionable strategies Dr Jean said, emphasizing the importance of reaching both hearts and minds to drive change.

Highlighting innovative approaches Dr said, "One example of reaching the community through their hearts and minds is the Masters of Public Health Leadership Program (MPHL) directed by Save the Mothers at Uganda Christian University." The MPHL program targets multidisciplinary professionals to advocate for safe motherhood.

Dr Jean also showcased STM's Mother Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative, a creative and impactful strategy to enhance maternal and child health at healthcare facilities.

To provide safe motherhood Dr Jean noted the need to learn from the business world adding that companies like coco-cola reach various communities and never stop sending the message.

Dr Jean urged all stakeholders in the safe motherhood space to adopt an intentional and persistent approach, committing to 'becoming strong and staying strong' in their service to mothers and babies.
